First Lesson

I Kings 8:37-43

At the dedication of the Temple, Solomon prayed: "If there is famine in the land, if there is pestilence or blight or mildew or locust or caterpillar; if their enemy besieges them in any of their cities; whatever plague, whatever sickness there is; whatever prayer, whatever supplication is made by any man or by all thy people Israel, each knowing the affliction of his own heart and stretching out his hands toward this house; then hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place, and forgive, and act, and render to each whose heart thou knowest, according to all his ways (for thou, thou only, knowest the hearts of all the children of men); that they may fear thee all the days that they live in the land which thou gavest to our fathers. "Likewise when a foreigner, who is not of thy people Israel, comes from a far country for thy name's sake (for they shall hear of thy great name, and thy mighty hand, and of thy outstretched arm), when he comes and prays toward this house, hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place, and do according to all for which the foreigner calls to thee; in order that all the peoples of the earth may know thy name and fear thee, as do thy people Israel, and that they may know that this house which I have built is called by thy name."

For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you abstain from [sexual immorality]; that each one of you know how to take a wife for himself in holiness and honor, not in the passion of lust like heathen who do not know God; that no man transgress, and wrong his brother in this matter, because the Lord is an avenger in all these things, as we solemnly forewarned you. For God has not called us for uncleanness, but in holiness. Therefore whoever disregards this, disregards not man but God, who [has given us] his Holy Spirit.

SACRAMENT OF CONFESSION


Jesus Christ, in His abundant love and mercy, established the Sacrament of Confession (*aka* Reconciliation or Penance) so that we as sinners can obtain forgiveness for our sins and reconcile with God and the Church. The sacrament washes us clean and renews us in Christ. Jesus said to the Apostles:

"Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive ye the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained" (St. John 20:21-23).

In keeping with this tradition, Confessions will be heard every Saturday morning in Lent at 8:30am.

The Rules for Fasting and Abstinence are as follows:

No meat on Ash Wednesday or any Friday of Lent. 1 main meal on these days, with 2 snacks. Those who are ill or of advanced age are not required to Fast.
